SUBJECT : Appointments to the Historical Resources Board

It is my pleasure to appoint Salvador Aréchiga and Alex Bethke to the Historical Resources Board, subject to your confirmation.

Salvador Aréchiga, LEED AP, is an Architect for Nadel Architects, Inc. and has more than 15 years experience providing architectural services and design. His architectural body of work includes design, planning, new construction, and construction administration for a variety of residential, commercial, retail, affordable housing, and mixed-use projects. Mr. Aréchiga's project experience includes Classic Residence by Hyatt at La Jolla Villa Towers, Civic View Corporate Center in San Marcos, California, Liberty Station Marketplace, and Point Loma Fire Station #22. At Nadel Architects, Mr. Aréchiga is actively engaged in the inclusion of "green building" and sustainable building features in architectural design projects. He co-founded the Nadel Green Committee which advocates for sustainable design and environmentally-responsible architecture. Mr. Aréchiga's architectural work history includes serving as a Job Captain and Construction Administrator for Hedenkamp & Associates Architecture and Planning, and Senior Designer/Draftsman for Jack in the Box, Inc. Mr. Aréchiga also freelanced as an Architectural Designer from 2003-2004.

Aside from Mr. Aréchiga's architectural responsibilities, he is committed to contributing his time and expertise to benefit the public and serve the community. He is a dedicated and active member of the North Park Planning Committee (NPPC), and Co-Chairs the Public Facilities, Transportation, Parks, and Public Art Subcommittee for the NPPC. While serving on the NPPC, Mr. Aréchiga has had the opportunity to review a wide range of development and redevelopment projects, as well as various historic and preservation issues.

Mr. Aréchiga received a Bachelor of Architecture degree from the Universidad Autónoma de Baja California in Mexicali, Baja, California. He also received a Construction Inspection Certificate from Southwestern Community College in 1993, and became a LEED Accredited Professional (Leadership in Energy & Environmental Design) in January 2009.

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Mr. Aréchiga was previously nominated by Councilmember Toni Atkins, and will serve as the required Architect for the Historical Resources Board. He will replace John Eisenhart, who has resigned, for a term expiring March 1, 2010. Mr. Aréchiga resides in University Heights.

Alex Bethke is a Historian/Cultural Resource Manager for Naval Facilities Engineering Command Southwest, and has extensive expertise in historic preservation and cultural resources. In his current position, Mr. Bethke assists with managing the Navy's historic resources, coordinates on National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) to ensure compliance with federal standards, and works to maintain a balance between historic preservation and Navy or Marine Corps mission critical projects. Currently, Mr. Bethke also serves as the Consulting Historian for the Flanders Hotel in Ocean City, New Jersey and has been instrumental in evaluating the hotel for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. Previously, Mr. Bethke was a Historic Preservation Planner for the Delaware County Planning Department, Historic Consultant for the City of Phoenix's Historic Preservation Office in Phoenix, Arizona, a volunteer Exhibit Researcher/Curator for the City of Phoenix Public Library, and a Curatorial Assistant for the San Diego Hall of Champions. Mr. Bethke began his career as a Preservation Assistant for Architect Milford Wayne Donaldson.

Mr. Bethke's diverse professional experiences and training in historic preservation, public history, architectural history, and cultural resources has given him the opportunity to advise public officials, boards, commissions, architects, and military and civilian officials. He has also produced numerous technical reports and made insightful recommendations utilizing his vast knowledge and training in historic preservation planning. Mr. Bethke's work at the local, county, and federal levels, unique experiences in educating the public and evaluating the historical significance of buildings and resources, as well as his insight into local preservation methodology will be valuable additions to the Historical Resources Board.

Mr. Bethke received a Bachelor of Arts degree in History and Political Science from the University of San Diego, and a Master of Arts degree in History/Public History from Arizona State University in Tempe, Arizona. He will replace David Marshall, who has resigned, for a term expiring March 1, 2010. Mr. Bethke resides in Normal Heights.

I ask that you confirm these appointments and join me in acknowledging Mr. Aréchiga and Mr. Bethke for their willingness to give their time and expertise to serve the City of San Diego.







Construction Documents

Point Loma Fire Station #22

San Diego, California

This new 6,000 S.F. facility replaces the existing smaller station that has outgrown its capacity to serve the community of Point Loma. It is designed with Spanish and Post-modern styles to complement the character of its surroundings. An entrance pavilion receives the public with arches reminiscent of traditional local elements and columns clad with images that document the fire station and community history.

Liberty Station Marketplace

San Diego, California

Over 175,000 SF of extensive exterior and interior restoration and rehabilitation, new construction, parking and landscaping have transformed these previously abandoned buildings of the Naval Training Center into the premiere shopping, dining and commercial office destination in Point Loma, now known as Liberty Station.

Classic Residence by Hyatt at La Jolla Village Towers

San Diego, California

Addition of a new 20-story senior residential tower to reflect the footprint of the existing adjacent tower. This project includes 180 new dwellings as well as 100,000 square feet of common facilities, 3 levels of underground parking, and a remodel of the existing tower.

Civic View Corporate Centre

San Marcos, California

A five story stone and glass tower becomes the marker for this core area of the city named "heart of the city". The building provides its users the flexibility of both square punched opening glass windows and floor to ceiling horizontal ribbon glass that opens views and reflects its landscaped surroundings.

San Marcos, California

A 1 & 2 story 60,000 S.F. four building retail center located in San Marcos, California. The complex is unified by a central park that includes fountains, fire pit, outdoor restaurant seating, sound stage, and a movie projection screen for evening entertainment. Stone clad entry elements with illuminated metal crowns become a welcome for visitors to the "Heart Of The City" area in San Marcos.

Ventana Real Lot 3

Carlsbad, California

This 2 story, 60,000 S.F. office building is constructed of cast concrete which feature a classical influenced exterior punched opening pattern and complementary modern horizontal reflective glass ribbon windows at both levels.



Waller/Simon Residence

San Diego, California

787 square feet of a new construction for a recreation room added to the back yard of an existing 1,688 square foot 2-story single-family dwelling. The existing house features Spanish architecture and has a historic designation by the San Diego Historic Review Board. The recreation room consists of an entry patio, game/media area with wine storage, an art studio, a full bathroom with a linen closet, storage room, laundry closet, and extended wood deck. The architectural features of the design follow the existing Spanish architecture of the house and maximize the views into the adjacent canyon.



Bradley/Forman Residence

Bradley/Forman Residence

Del Mar, California

An existing 2 story 2,276 square foot single-family dwelling in Del Mar, CA, the new design consists of a 1,065 square foot remodel and addition to the existing residence comprising a 510 square foot remodel/addition to the first floor and 555 square foot remodel/addition to the second floor. The first floor remodels the family room to include a new area for an office and a newly designed breakfast area. The second floor consists of a remodel of the existing two bedrooms to create a new master suite with new balcony, master bathroom, and a new walk-in closet.



Golden Residence

Aguilar/Holland Residence

San Diego, California

A two-story, 1,500 square foot addition to an existing one story 1,000 square foot single-family Craftsman residence in the University Heights neighborhood of San Diego. The first floor includes the addition of a new family room and half restroom, and a new staircase. The second floor consists of a new master bedroom with balcony, new master bathroom, and a new walk-in closet. The idea with this project was to maximize the canyon views from both the new family room and the new master bedroom by utilizing expansive windows and adding a wrap-around balcony for the master bedroom.

A 170 square feet balcony addition to maximize the use of the small back yard and canyon view of an existing 800 square foot one story (with basement) craftsman, single-family dwelling in the Hillcrest area of San Diego built on sloped sub-standard lot. The balcony is covered by a trellis that conforms to the same features of the main house. It is accessible by a small stair case that opens up to a grill area and a seating area. The new balcony created a new covered terrace.

Remodel of an exiting balcony for 2-story single-family dwelling in the Clairemont area of San Diego. The design consists of raising the existing balcony and reconfiguring it to add a more comfortable area for outdoor seating and to maximize the canyon views.

Gray Residence

San Diego, California

150 square feet addition of a new front patio to an existing single-family dwelling in the Alvarado Canyon area of San Diego. The design consists of a raised concrete patio with a retainer planter and a sitting area which includes a water feature.

Gerber Residence

San Diego, California

A 257 square feet addition of a front court yard, 319 square feet addition of a carport, and a remodel of existing side yard for at a single-family Spanish residence in the Kensington neighborhood of San Diego. The new courtyard and the carport resemble the Spanish features of the existing house creating a gathering/sitting area at the front and south side of the exiting lot. The design includes a series of water features and a "conversation pit" with a fire feature.



DATE OF FINAL PASSAGE _____

WHEREAS, the Historical Resources Board [HRB] was established in 1965 by the City Council in accordance with City Charter section 43; and

WHEREAS, in 1985, the City of San Diego became a Certified Local Government [CLG] pursuant to the National Historic Preservation Act, section 101(c), for its implementation of a local historical preservation program based on federal and state standards; and

WHEREAS, the CLG program makes the City of San Diego eligible for various benefits, including eligibility for a share of the state's Annual Historic Preservation Fund; and

WHEREAS, the CLG program requires that the City of San Diego establish a qualified preservation review commission under local law, which is to be comprised of at least five members, all having a demonstrated interest in, competence in, or knowledge of historic preservation; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego has granted authority to its preservation review commission, the HRB, under San Diego Municipal Code, Land Development Code section 111.0206, which establishes an 11-member Board, with each member to be appointed by the Mayor and subject to confirmation by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego Municipal Code provides that each member shall serve a two-year term without compensation and shall continue to serve until a successor is appointed; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego Municipal Code provides that no member shall serve more than four consecutive terms; members shall be appointed so that the terms of not more than six members will expire in any year; and the expiration date of all terms of appointment shall be March 1; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego Municipal Code states that the Mayor may designate one member as Chairperson during March of each year. If the Mayor has not designated a chairperson by April 15, the Board shall elect a Chairperson from among its members; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego Municipal Code provides that at least one Board member shall be appointed from among professionals in each of the following disciplines as required to meet the "Certified Local Government" criteria of the State Office of Historic Preservation, as established by the National Historic Preservation Act: architecture, history, architectural history, archaeology, and landscape architecture. Other members appointed may have experience or background in law, real estate, engineering, general contracting, finance, planning, or fine arts and should reflect diverse neighborhood representation and have demonstrated a special interest in historical preservation. No more than three owners of designated historical resources shall serve at any time; and

WHEREAS, two members are serving on expired terms and do not wish to be reappointed; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that the following appointments by the Mayor to serve as members of the Historical Resources Board, for terms ending as indicated, be and the same are hereby confirmed:
