Proceeds from this initial series of economic development revenue bonds for Southwest Marine, Inc. will be used for acquisition of a floating drydock and related improvements at the Company's Sampson Street facility. The City Council adopted Inducement Resolution R-255319 on November 2, 1981, which provides for issue of bonds up to \$30,000,000. After consideration of a staff evaluation report, the City Council adopted Resolution R-256923 on August 2, 1982 authorizing the City Manager to continue with preparation of documents for the bond issue. Southwest Marine has contracted with Kawasaki Heavy Industries Ltd. of Japan for construction of the drydock.

Bond issuance in two or more series, up to a total of \$20,000,000, is now planned. This docket item covers the initial series which is not to exceed \$7,000,000. This initial series will be purchased by Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith. Maturity and interest will be as specified in the indenture and are now projected at 10 years and 9.625 percent. Primary security for the bonds will be a standby letter of credit issued by Wells Fargo Bank. The indenture specifies that the bonds and interest thereon will be paid by Southwest Marine, Inc. and that "neither the faith and credit, nor the taxing power of the City is pledged to the payment of principal or interest on the bonds." Issue of subsequent series will be subject to separate, specific City Council authorization.

Documents, drafts of which are on file with the City Clerk, include a loan agreement between the City and Southwest Marine; a trust indenture between the City and First Interstate Bank of California; a bond purchase agreement among the City, Southwest Marine and the Purchaser; a letter of credit from Wells Fargo Bank; and a letter agreement covering Orrick, Herrington & Sutcliffe's services as Bond Counsel.

## CITY MANAGER REPORT:

There are two agreements associated with this project. One is for the design and improvement of San Dieguito Road and the other is for the widening and realignment of portions of El Camino Real.

The agreement for San Dieguito Road requires the developer to post a bond and complete the required improvements within a five year period. The actual time of construction shall be determined by the City Engineer and the developer shall start construction within 90 days of notification. At the end of the five year period, if construction has not started, the developer shall construct the required improvements or the City Engineer may recommend to Council the renewal of the agreement, subject to certain conditions.

The developer is also required to improve, widen and realign portions of El Camino Real, but the developer has been unable to acquire the needed right-of- way. Per the agreement, the City agrees to acquire by negotiation or condemnation that portion of right-of-way required for El Camino Real. The developer agrees to deposit funds with the City Property Department for all costs associated with the task of acquisition. The developer also agrees that upon acquisition of the right-of-way that El Camino Real will be improved as required. The costs of the improvements have been included in the estimate for the work required for Fairbanks Country Club Unit No. 1 and a bond has already been posted.
