A public hearing, attended by 60 to 75 citizens, was held on the proposed expansion on October 13, 1988, with a follow-up mail poll conducted 2 weeks later. Based on the results of the studies, the hearing, and the poll, staff determined that the following streets and address ranges (Area I) should be included in Residential Permit Area B:

- 1. Rose Place from 4730 to 4760 (entire cul-de-sac).
- 2. Stone Court from 5200 to 5299 (entire cul-de-sac).
- 3. 62nd Street from 4770 to 4840 (between Rose Street and Hobart Street).

Staff also determined that the following streets (Area II) should not be included in Area B, based on low parking occupancy rates and/or low levels of public support in the mail poll:

- 1. Bixel Street (Drover Drive END).
- 2. Dorman Drive (Drover Drive END).
- 3. Rose Street (entire length).
- 4. Stewart Street (entire length).

All criteria established by Division 20 have been met. It is recommended that Residential Parking Area B be extended to include Area I as described above.

Additionally, the projects require specific technical skills and expertise that are not now available within present City staff. Consultants submitted letters of interest and five were interviewed in conformance with Council Policy 300-7. The firm of P and D Technologies, Inc. was selected as the recommended consultant. They would be responsible for developing all engineering features of the projects, including preparation of construction documents.
