CITY MANAGER SUPPORTING INFORMATION: On September 6, 1990, the Civil Service Commission reviewed the request for the Waste Management Department to create the position of Assistant Deputy Director in the Refuse Disposal Division and determined that the position meets the criteria of the Charter and supports exemption from the Classified Service. The Assistant Deputy Director will report to the Refuse Disposal Division Deputy Director and will have significant responsibility for formulating departmental policies and procedures. The Assistant Deputy Director shall provide the necessary administrative and management oversight to control the day-to-day activities of the 97 person division. Within the Division organization structure the Assistant Deputy Director will ensure the efficient and effective operation of this diverse division and enable the department to meet the mandated goals. The Waste Management Department is initiating a wide variety of programs in order to meet various mandated recycling goals. Within the Refuse Disposal Division these programs include a Materials Recovery Facility, Green Material, Woodwaste and Demolition Material recycling projects, and a composting facility. An Assistant Deputy Director will aid the department to manage its resources and provide the administrative skills necessary to implement these projects in order to achieve these recycling goals.

Request for Villas at Wateridge - Rezoning, Planned Commercial Development, Coastal Development and Planned Industrial Permits RZ, PCD, CDP & PID-90-1123 (amending PID-40-021), amendment to the Mira Mesa Community Plan and Local Coastal Program. The subject property is located south of Lusk Boulevard, east of Wateridge Vista Drive and Wateridge Circle, between Wateridge Circle and Mira Mesa Boulevard, in Zone M-IP (proposed Zone CA), in the Mira Mesa Community Plan area, and is more particularly described as Lots 8-17 of Wateridge I, Final Map-10602.

The proposed rezone from M-IP Zone (Manufacturing Industrial Park) to CA Zone (Commercial Area Shopping Center) is consistent with the proposed community plan amendment.

The Planned Commercial Development and Coastal Development Permits PCD-90-1123 & CDP-90-1123 propose a multi-family residential and commercial recreational center to be developed in an area currently designated for industrial park and open space uses. The residential development proposed 344 apartment units, with a 5,000 square-foot athletic center for use by both the residents and employees of the surrounding area. The Planned Industrial Development Permit PID-90-1123 (amending PID-40-021) would allow for the deletion of 24.5-acres from the existing 89-acre Wateridge Industrial Park to be used for residential and commercial uses under the proposed Planned Commercial Development.

The amendment to the Mira Mesa Community Plan proposes to change the land use designation of 24.5-acres from Industrial Park and Open Space to Medium-Low Density Residential (16-29 dwelling units per acre), Specialized Commercial and Open Space. The proposed plan amendment and rezone also constitute an amendment to the City of San Diego's Local Coastal

Program. If approved by the City Council, the proposed Local Coastal Program amendment must be submitted to the California Coastal Commission for review and final approval. The proposed Local Coastal Program amendment would not become effective until approval by the California Coastal Commission.

This area is currently designated in the Community Plan for Residential/Commercial/Industrial mixed-use development but has been primarily built-out with small-scale residential development.

3) Approval of a rezoning of Newton Avenue between 26th and 27th Street. As shown on Rezone Map B-3983, this area is proposed to be rezoned from Subdistrict "A" (Residential/Commercial/Industrial) to Subdistrict "C" (Exclusively Residential) of the Barrio Logan Planned

District Ordinance.

4) Approval of an amendment to the Local Coastal Program (LCP) required as a result of the proposed rezone and amendments to the Community Plan and Planned District Ordinance. If adopted by the City, the proposed LCP amendment must be submitted to the California Coastal Commission for review and certifications. The LCP amendment will not become effective until after approval by the California Coastal Commission.

CITY MANAGER SUPPORTING INFORMATION: Title 8 of the California Code of Regulations sets forth the employee safety rules and regulations enforced by CAL/OSHA. The employee safety regulations monitored by CAL/OSHA have been significantly impacted by the passage of SB 198 which requires employers to establish, implement, and maintain an effective Injury/Illness Prevention Program. In order to determine the overall compliance of City operations with SB 198 (Title 8, amended Section 3203), it will be necessary to perform a needs analysis and assessment involving the evaluation of occupational hazards, employee training, inspection frequencies and safety equipment necessary for employees to perform their jobs in a safe and hazard-free environment. Professional consulting services are needed to perform this comprehensive assessment of safety programs relative to the requirements of SB 198 as well as to provide an overall evaluation of hazards in the workplace. Through the efforts of the Risk Management Department, a Request for Proposals was issued for a needs analysis and assessment of City operations consistent with SB 198 safety requirements. The bidding documents were advertised in the San Diego Daily Transcript, San Diego Voice and Viewpoint, La Prensa San Diego, and the San Diego Asian

Journal. A Consultant Selection Panel consisting of safety and administrative staff from the Risk Management Department evaluated the proposals and qualifications received based upon criteria which is consistent with Administrative Regulation 25.70. Health Sciences Associates was selected to provide the Citywide needs analysis and assessment of general safety standards based on overall experience, expertise of staff and cost effectiveness.
