#### MAYOR COMMENT:

On behalf of Mayor Sanders, Chief Financial Officer, Jay Goldstone presented an update on the Mt. Soledad landslides and on the 2007 Wildfire Recovery efforts.

The first phase of construction has be gun on stabilizing Soledad Mountain Road by installing thirty-seven shear pins. Geotechnical investigations as to the cause of the slides continue during construction. City staff and City—hired consultants continue to share their geotechnical data with private geotechnical consultants to develop methods for repairing damaged roadways and stabilizing the slide area. Staff is onsite ready to assist homeowners. Within the next couple of weeks, discussions will begin in Closed Session regarding phase two and phase three.

With respect to the wildfire recovery, staff continues to meet with the County, Federal Emergency Management Agency, and State officials to plan a recovery effort and to analyze the response to the wildfires. Local assistance center hours will be reduced based on the current demands. A comprehensive clean up program has been implemented for the City and a debris removal program will expedite the debris removal from private properties and get the sites ready for reconstruction. The City is working on erosion control. Damaged and destroyed trees will be removed within the next two weeks. Over a hundred miles of streets and storm drains have been inspected for fire and wind damage.

A valid appeal must be filed with the City Clerk no later than 2:00 p.m., 10 calendar days from the date of this Notice stating briefly which of the above findings made by the City Engineer was improper or incorrect and the basis for that conclusion.
