REQUESTED ACTION:

Redevelopment Agency approval of the proposed First Amendment to the Agreement for Special Legal (“Condemnation”) Services with Best, Best & Krieger, LLP (“BBK”) to add \$100,000 to the compensation. The maximum compensation will not exceed \$350,000.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

That the Redevelopment Agency approve the First Amendment to the Agreement for Condemnation Services with BBK.

SUMMARY:

BACKGROUND

In October 2005 the Redevelopment Agency approved an Agreement with BBK for Condemnation Services. The Redevelopment Agency entered into the Agreement to provide legal services associated with the acquisition of one parcel of land required for the Renaissance Hotel Project located in the Gaslamp Quarter.

Trial in the eminent domain matter concluded in November 2005, with a jury verdict favoring the property owner. The jury verdict has been appealed on several legal issues, and the purpose of the proposed Amendment is to provide legal services during this appeal phase of the lawsuit.

PROPOSED AMENDED AGREEMENT

The proposed Amendment to the Agreement includes this provision:

- The Consultant has the background experience and potential of providing legal services during the appeal phase of the lawsuit.

FISCAL CONSIDERATIONS:

Funds are available in the Fiscal Year 2006 Gaslamp Quarter Budget for legal services. The Developer of the Renaissance Hotel Project has deposited sufficient funds with the Corporation to cover the costs of the proposed Amendment.
