SUBJECT: State of the CIP Status Report and CIP FY2013 Construction Projects Contract Award List

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

This is an informational item. Please accept the Report.

**SUMMARY:**

Thanks to Mayor Sanders' leadership, City Council support, and the dedication of staff in numerous departments, Capital Improvements Program Review and Advisory Committee (CIPRAC) presents to you the City's first issue of the State of the CIP Status Report (Report).

The Report has been prepared in compliance with Section H(1), Council Policy 000-31. It provides an introduction to the citywide Capital Improvement Program (CIP) process, summarizes the CIP related accomplishments in the Fiscal Year (FY) 2012 and where possible updated information about activities in the FY 2013 and tracks schedule and budget commitments for project delivery. The Report also includes information on current trends/issues of importance to the CIP and presents CIPRAC's assessment of challenges ahead and recommendations.

The Report is also accompanied by an updated version of the "CIP FY2013 Construction Projects Contract Award List" as a stand-alone document. The information was last submitted as part of the Mayor's May Revision to the budget.

This submittal, when used in conjunction with information on the City's CIP website and in the Budget Books, provides the City Council and the public with an opportunity to review up-to-date information on projects in the adopted capital budgets. By providing an update on the citywide CIP, staff is able to effectively communicate the latest progress on active projects and update the City Council on any significant change. The Report however focuses on information readily available through Public Works Department (PWD) databases and takes into account the data available from other asset owning departments where possible. Although PWD has authored the submittal, CIPRAC membership contributed to its completion.

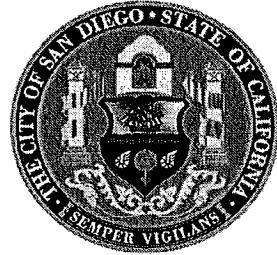

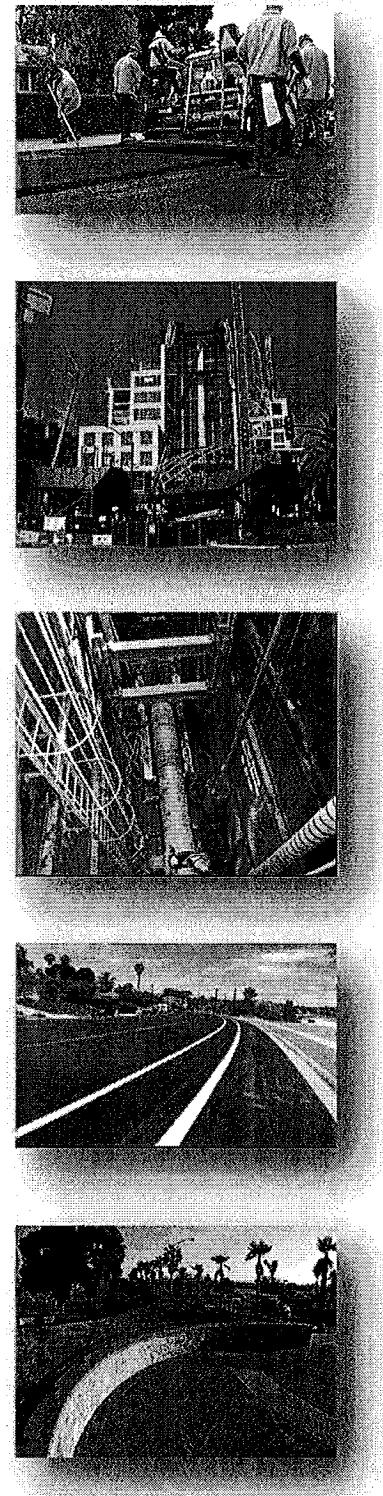

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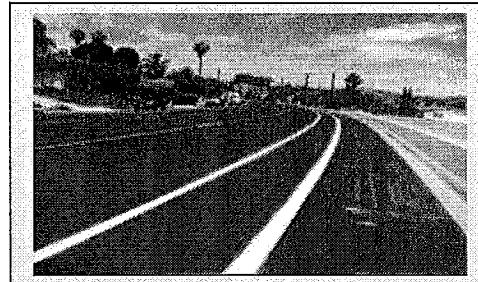
## **SECTION I**

### **INTRODUCTION**

#### **A. BACKGROUND**

Council Policy 000-31, Section H(1) which went into effect on April 5<sup>th</sup>, 2012 requires CIPRAC to “provide semi-annual presentations/reports to the Budget and Finance Committee covering the state of the CIP.” This is the first CIPRAC’s report in response to the City Council Policy 000-31. The Report also discusses the process improvements gained from the consolidation of contract procurement into the Public Works Department (PWD), implementation of the CIP Streamlining measures approved by the City Council, accomplishments, and successful implementation of the City’s SLBE (Small/Local Business Enterprises) program.

Furthermore, it includes information on current trends and issues of importance to the CIP. Included in this Report are staff recommendations to improve efficiencies and promote cost savings even further in the execution of the program.



#### **B. PURPOSE AND SCOPE**

By providing an update on the CIP, staff is able to effectively communicate the latest progress on active projects and update City Council on any significant change(s). This Report provides up-to-date information on the status of active CIP projects in the PWD’s database and other departments’ databases (where possible) to help facilitate decision making in the upcoming budget cycle. While the annual budget process continues to be the primary mechanism for defining, prioritizing, and funding projects, the information provided in this Report augments the 2012 CIP Budget document.

The following items are covered in the Report where available:

1. Construction Projects – projects that result in the construction of capital improvements. These projects are typically bid by and awarded to a contractor. However, construction projects can also be completed by City forces, or other jurisdictions or entities through an agreement with the City.
2. Non-construction Projects – projects that indirectly lead to the construction of capital improvements such as feasibility studies and master planning efforts as well as Real Estate transactions. However, Real Estate and transactional projects are not included in this edition of the Report.
3. Public Art Projects – projects involving artworks funded by the CIP. Public art projects may be associated with a specific capital improvement project or as part of a larger public art strategy with funding support from the CIP.

4. Service Agreements – Service agreements with other agencies or private firms hired to provide professional services (e.g., design) in support of the CIP.

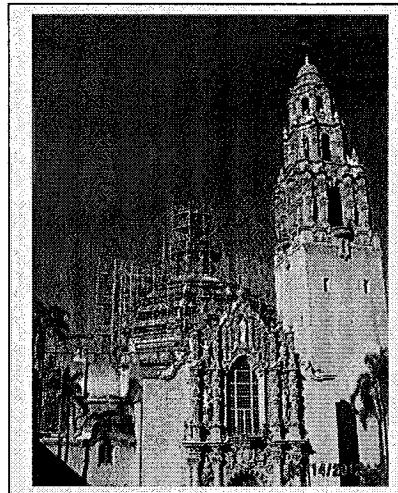
This Report excludes the following:

- Projects implemented by Redevelopment Agencies or Civic San Diego (formerly known as CCDC and SEDC);
- Other items in the CIP budget such as staffing and equipment purchases; and
- Projects funded by private developments that will be transferred to the City depending on the developers' schedules.

Furthermore, this edition of the Report lacks a complete account of the projects tracked independently by asset owning departments e.g., Environmental Services Department and Public Utilities Department due to the current decentralized information system.

#### C. **CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PROGRAM (CIP)**

The City's CIP is a multi-year forecast of capital needs which includes new construction projects and planned improvements of existing facilities. The CIP establishes structure and consistency by identifying, prioritizing, approving, and funding capital improvement projects through coordination with the participating City departments, CIPRAC and feedback from the community and City Council. Implementation of CIP projects is based on the City's adopted General Plan and applicable community plans. However, the amount of CIP progress is balanced against the priorities of various funding sources and the overall services provided by the City.



#### D. **CIP PROJECTS**

What is defined as a capital project may vary from agency to agency. Generally, CIP projects are tangible items that have a life expectancy greater than one year and will be accounted for as fixed assets with values for capitalization purposes. City Council Policy 000-02 clearly establishes when a project is capital in nature which means it results in capitalized assets that have values for assessment of prosperity and financing purposes. The City also forecasts and directs its CIP projects where it believes it will face future demands and growth.

The CIP encompasses a wide range of projects administered by a number of departments and funded with a variety of sources. Projects are identified and funded by the asset owning departments (e.g., Airports, Environmental Services, Fire-Rescue, Library, Park & Recreation, Police, Public Utilities, Public Works-General Services, and Transportation & Storm Water) who also manages, operates, and/or maintains the asset. Repair and maintenance records, public inquiries, legal requirements,

promotional programs, and City Council requests are the usual triggers for initiating CIP projects.

The CIP does not necessarily rely on the City's General Fund. Many projects are funded through a variety of sources which frequently have conditions and restrictions on how funds can be spent. Some departments have enterprise funds based on the collection of fees that can only be used for department-specific projects, like the construction of water and sewer pipes. General fund departments may rely on developer fees and assessments, capital outlays, and grants, among other sources. Examples of funding sources include: sewer and water fees, a one half-cent local sales tax for transportation improvements, development impact fees, facility benefit assessments, private donations, City-owned property sales, and state and federal grants. Financing in the form of bonds may be utilized for large and/or costly projects, and deferred capital project needs.

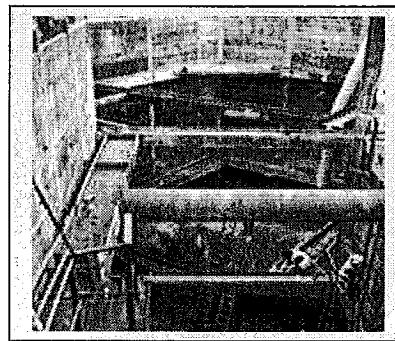
Since the demand for capital projects typically exceeds the amount of funds available, projects are prioritized. Prior to undertaking the development of the annual CIP budget, staff refers to pre-defined criteria for what kind of projects or equipment are to be considered for the project portfolio. Furthermore, the CIP prioritization process used by CIPRAC establishes guidelines for an objective process in the selection and ranking of projects (i.e., Council Policy 800-14) which then provides the decision-makers with a basis for optimizing the use of available funding resources.

Once the CIP list of projects is finalized during the annual Budget approval process, the City holds public hearing(s) for community input prior to final adoption by City Council. The CIP Budget Development Calendar (included in the Budget Books) shows the timeline of this process.

#### E. **PROJECT SCHEDULES**

The CIP website (<http://www.sandiego.gov/cip/index.shtml>) provides schedule information by phase and completion date for active projects in the PWD database. Projects are sorted by CIP identification number. For the purposes of this Report, a project is considered to be complete when it is available for its intended use. There may be a significant period of time between project physical completion and project acceptance. Issues such as completion of "punch list" items (i.e., remaining minor construction items to be completed) or settling of contractor claims may take additional time which could delay project acceptance.

Baseline schedules are established for projects as a commitment for delivery and a reference point for measuring on-time project delivery performance. For construction projects, baseline schedules are typically established at major milestones such as preliminary engineering, design, and the time of contract award. For non-construction projects, baseline schedules are typically established once the scope has been defined and a budget has been established.



Baseline schedules can also be derived from commitments that have been made through the budget process, general obligation bond programs, or Mayoral and the City Council direction.

Schedules may be “reestablished” for some projects due to significant scope changes that impact the original committed schedule or the Mayoral/City Council directed reprioritization. The completion dates used for this Report reflect the project’s actual status. The status of the projects will be represented by one of the following categories:

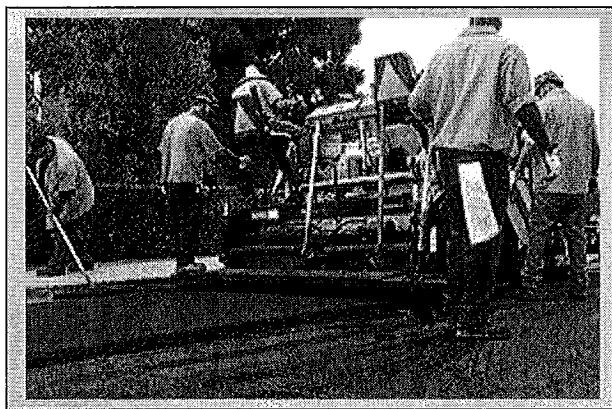
- 1. On Schedule:** It is important that projects are on schedule since there are usually deadlines associated with civic events, environmental requirements, moratoriums, coordination with other City and non-City contracts, and other time constraints. Projects are determined to be on schedule if they are to be completed within 1 month prior to the committed substantial completion date. Projects are also in this category if no previous schedule commitment existed, in which case a schedule is being established with this Report. This may include projects that had pending schedules at the time of the previous report. Schedules for public art projects that are adjusted in order to align with the implementation of their associated capital improvement projects are considered to be on schedule.
- 2. Extended Schedule:** Projects have extended schedules when the project is running more than 22 Working Days behind the committed delivery date i.e., Substantial Completion. Representation of a project as “extended” in this Report does not constitute resetting the baseline schedule for the project. Unless the project delivery team is able to make up the delay prior to project completion, these projects will track as extended schedule projects.
- 3. Reset Schedule:** Projects that have their schedules reset are those where committed schedules are no longer feasible as a result of significant changes in scope, bid protests or due to Council or Mayor directed reprioritization. The goal with these projects is to update to reflect realistic schedules for delivery. Since the process for resetting projects is still being developed by CIPRAC, this edition of the Report does not account for those.
- 4. Pending Schedule:** Projects that do not have schedules at the time of this Report are noted as Pending. The schedules for these projects are uncertain due to incomplete scoping, community concerns, real estate, or funding issues. A number of new projects beginning activity in FY 2012 have not been fully scoped and are thus marked as schedule pending. Projects with schedules pending are not counted as active projects.
- 5. On-hold Schedule:** Project schedules that have been deferred and placed on-hold.

## F. **PROJECT BUDGETS**

Project specific budget information is included for FY 2012 projects posted on the CIP website. Budget figures provided reflect the current funding programmed for that particular project in the City's CIP. This includes all past, current, and future fiscal

years of funding. Budget resets (when referenced) in the Report reflect changes to the baseline budget upon the City Council's approval.

Baseline budgets are set when the CIP budget is approved by the City Council. The baseline budget is used to serve as a commitment for delivery and a reference point for measuring "on-budget" project delivery performance. It is important to note that the baseline budget for a project may not match the latest budget forecasts. Projects that have their baseline budgets reset are those where committed budget amounts are no longer feasible as a result of significant changes in scope.



## SECTION II

# PROGRAM OVERVIEW

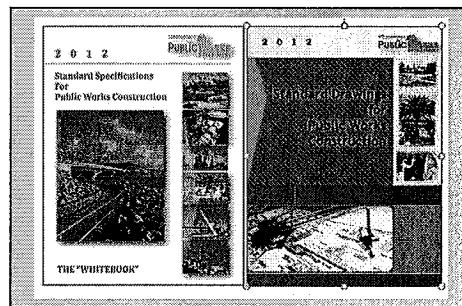
### A. CAPITAL PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS AND TRENDS

#### 1) Capital Program Alignment With Citywide Plans And Policies And State Regulations

- a) *CIP Alignment with 2008 General Plan* - With the 2008 update of the City's General Plan, the significance of successfully aligning CIP efforts lies in our ability as a City to not only have a vision for our future but also a plan for the infrastructure necessary to support that vision. Close coordination between staff in master planning and the General Plan update is ongoing to ensure cohesive and consistent plans that align with the City's vision that is "a well-managed City government supporting a thriving and sustainable San Diego - America's Finest City." Therefore, CIPRAC continues to adhere to the "Guiding Principles" in the General Plan through the General Plan Update process, master planning for City facilities, and executing the CIP.
- b) *City's Strategic Plan* - The CIPRAC also continues to adhere to the Strategic Goals and Objectives in the City's Strategic Plan to ensure that its membership is working toward the same end.
- c) *California Regional Water Quality Control Board - General Construction Permit (CGP)* - The CGP regulates discharges of pollutants in storm water associated with construction activities to waters of the United States from construction sites that disturb one or more acres of land surface. To ensure compliance with this permit, staff from Public Works Department (PWD) and Transportation & Storm Water Department updated the Standard Specification for Public Works Construction (i.e., The WHITEBOOK). Additionally, Field Engineering staff oversees public and private construction projects, subject to CGP, for compliance with the permit's provisions including implementation of storm water construction best management practices, conducting sampling and monitoring, performing inspection, reporting and record keeping.
- d) *City of San Diego Standard Specifications and Standard Drawings Updates*

Some of the CIP streamlining measures contribute to streamlining City's contract documents and updating the City's Standard Specifications and Standard Drawings for the construction of public facilities.

The PWD took the lead to coordinate the modifications and updates.



Regularly updating the City's essential CIP contract standards e.g., specifications and drawings will improve business practices and provide

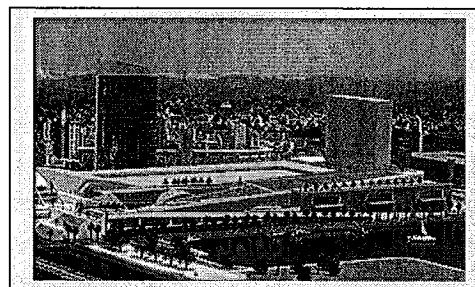
clarity and consistency not only in construction documents but also in the field, ultimately promoting cost savings by avoiding disputes and delays associated with ambiguity.

- e) *Complete Streets* –Effective January 1, 2011, state law requires that cities address complete streets upon revisions to their general plan circulation elements. The specific requirement is to “plan for a balanced, multimodal transportation network that meets the needs of all users of streets, roads, and highways for safe and convenient travel in a manner that is suitable to the rural, suburban, or urban context of the general plan.” The City’s General Plan Mobility Element as adopted in 2008 meets this requirement and sets the direction for the CIP transportation projects.

## 2) Major Projects - “Great Cities Are Defined by Great City Centers”

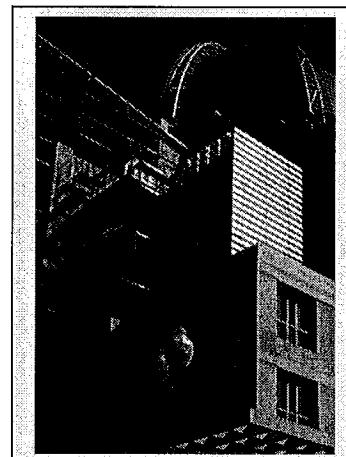
San Diego is one of the youngest metropolitan areas in America, and has a rich history and maturing economy and communities. The opportunity exists today to create great civic spaces and to highlight the City’s significance as a central touristic destination. The following projects taking shape in FY 2012 and FY 2013 are examples of these great opportunities.

- a) *Convention Center Expansion* - Following extensive outreach in the contracting community and a pre-qualification based Request for Proposals (RFP), “Clark/Hunt, A Joint Venture,” has been selected to provide Pre-Construction Services leading to a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP).



A Phased funded pre-construction services agreement has been negotiated which was approved for award by Council on October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012. As part of the contract, this \$460M Construction Manager at Risk (CMAR) project will incorporate significant local and small business outreach as an integral component of project delivery.

- b) *New Central Library* - San Diego’s new Central Library will be a public space unlike any other in San Diego. The new Central Library (which is also another CMAR project) will be an architectural landmark. Designed as perhaps the largest silver-rated LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) building in California, it was developed as a civic role model of sustainability and energy conservation. Table II(A)(2)(b)1 shows the current funding status of the project scheduled to be substantially complete in Spring of 2013.

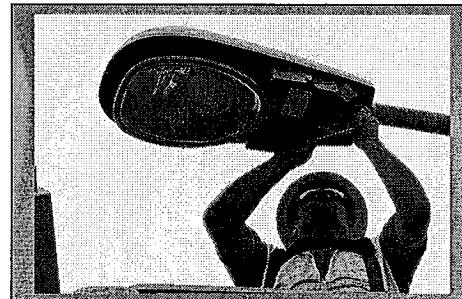

**3) CIP and Environmentally Sustainable Practices.** The City has been actively incorporating environmentally sustainable practices in the planning, building, and construction of CIP projects. The City's General Plan has a strong sustainability focus and provides local policies to address global climate change. Consequently, staff is closely coordinating the most current information and practices to comply and anticipate future needs.

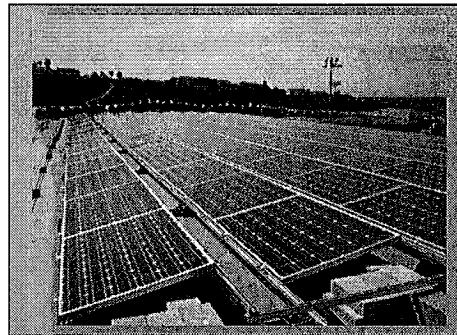
- a) *Hazardous and Regulated Waste Management* - With the implementation of enhanced specifications regarding hazardous and regulated waste management in the City's WHITEBOOK, the City now has a more proactive role in how contractors are identifying, storing, and disposing of hazardous and regulated waste generated during CIP activities. This proactive role minimizes unexpected costs to the project. Community Health and Safety Plans are also created when construction areas encounter hazardous or regulated wastes. These plans address the disposal of that waste as required to meet stringent California environmental regulations regardless of where the waste is disposed.
- b) *Broad Spectrum Lighting* - A citywide project to upgrade 80 percent of the City's street lights to energy-efficient fixtures that produce a whiter light that is more like moonlight. The project will save an estimated \$2.2 million annually from reduced energy and maintenance costs and 15 million kWh per year.



The \$16 million retrofit is funded by a financing package that includes a \$13 million bond, \$2 million in EECBG federal grant stimulus funding, and a \$3 million low-interest State loan. In addition, San Diego Gas & Electric will provide a one-time \$1.8 million rebate for the lighting change. More than 35,000 induction technology street light fixtures, using Induction Broad Spectrum light technology, will replace the old sodium vapor lamps. The new light fixtures will make colors easier to see at night because they produce a broader light spectrum than sodium vapors.

- c) *Energy Efficiency* - City Administration Building Boiler Replacement Project. This project replaced the existing system that provides steam to produce all domestic hot water and heat for the five buildings it serves, City Administration Building (CAB), Fire Station 1, Golden Hall, Civic Theatre, and the City Operations Building (COB). The system was replaced with new energy efficient boilers that use less gas, electricity, and water.
- d) *Uses & Energy Rates* - The CIP includes review of project uses in order to qualify for SDG&E rates that can save significant operating expense over time. In particular, planning and design ensures separation of sports and ball field lights as well as outdoor lights, from building meters that allow the City to achieve lower monthly energy bills. Example projects in the works include Scripps Ranch Recreational Center, and Cesar Chavez Recreational Center (Larsen Field).
- e) *Green Building* - The City of San Diego passed the amended Green Building Council Policy (900-14) in 2010 that mandates all new City buildings (e.g., New Central Library) and major retrofits include solar solutions and meet LEED Silver criteria. *Solar Energy - Solar Energy* - San Diego now has more solar installations than any other city in California. Of the 37 Megawatt Hours (MWh) produced in the community, more than 2 MWh of it is installed on City facilities. If one home needs 1 KWh of energy for one hour, then 1 MWh of energy can sustain 1000 homes for one hour. Fifteen municipal facilities fitted with photovoltaic will help the City reach its goal to pursue energy independence. San Diegans will save about \$1 million each year in energy costs with the City's two large solar systems; one at Otay Water Reclamation Plant and the other at the Alvarado Water Treatment Plant.

Also, the Scripps Ranch Recreation Center Photovoltaic (PV) Solar/Battery Project completed on June 30, 2012 has a 30KWh Photovoltaic solar system and 100KWh advanced Lithium -ion Battery Energy storage. The Solar system provides most of the power to the entire facility during the day saving the SDG&E electric charges at this facility.



The PV system charges the battery system for night use and when PV is not producing enough power. In case of emergency such as a black-out, this system provides power to the facility. The funding for this project came from Department of Energy, California Public Utilities Commission, and an incentive from California Solar Initiative managed by the California Center for Sustainable Energy. This is a pilot project and is the first of its kind.

- f) *Sustainable Landscapes* – The City continues to implement sustainable landscape techniques as identified in CP 200-14 for the design and construction of its park and recreation facilities. Furthermore, integrating

sustainable landscape design practices is becoming an important component of the City's projects. The City's designers integrate the standards and philosophies of other programs e.g., Sustainable Sites Initiative (SITES). SITES provides guidelines and recognition of sustainable landscapes based on their planning, design, construction and maintenance. This includes consideration of sustainable practices regarding site soil, hydrology, vegetation, materials, as well as human health and well-being.

- 4) Deferred Capital Bonds.** To address its aging streets, sidewalks, storm water pipes and buildings, the City issued its first of several planned capital bonds. Over the past several months, staff, the Independent Budget Analyst (IBA), and the Budget & Finance Committee (B&FC) have been working together discussing various funding options for the deferred capital backlog related to the general fund supported streets, storm drains, and building infrastructure assets. To rejuvenate the City's infrastructure, the team has developed and the Council approved a funding plan including deferred capital bonds over the next five years. The following table illustrates the status of the secured funding as of the FY 2012:

**5) Accelerated Streets/Paving Projects.**

Since 2001, the City has retained specialized consultants to perform pavement condition surveys. The most recent survey conducted in 2011 was the most comprehensive to date and has allowed the City to develop a detailed analysis of current street conditions.



Several new reforms with regard to the contract award process and contract billing procedure have greatly improved the City's ability to promptly implement street paving contracts.

In FY 2012 these changes along with an upturn in economic conditions and bond funding allowed the City, to pave approximately **65 miles** and slurry **226 miles** of City streets. This represents nearly double the street maintenance performed in the last two fiscal years combined.

- 6) Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Improvements.** To improve the accessibility of City facilities, libraries, and sidewalks, the City continued to include ADA compliance projects (separate or included with other construction

works) in its CIP. Table A(4)1 below shows the trend in ADA compliance construction activities over the past 3 fiscal years. See Exhibit A for details.

Note: Examples of additional ADA retrofit accomplishments other than curb ramps include ADA compliant audible pedestrian signals and pedestrian push buttons at intersections and sidewalks barriers removal.

**B. ORGANIZATIONAL CHANGES**

- 1) **Consolidation of Contracting Services and Public Works Department.** To streamline contracting for public-works projects the Mayor ordered the consolidation of the Contracting Services and Public Works Department. The Reorganization was intended to reduce time to award bids for CIP contracts. Under the reorganization, 14 positions were transferred from Purchasing and Contracting to the Public Works Department.
- 2) **CIP Review and Advisory Committee (CIPRAC) Evolution.** In response to the CIP Audit recommendations, CIPRAC's charter was significantly revised to increase its role and responsibilities. Now, CIPRAC's mandate is to provide a high level, cross functional review of the prioritization process for the entire City's CIP to ensure adherence to established practices (i.e., CP 800-14). CIPRAC is a high level committee comprised of City staff advising the Mayor. It ensures conformance with the Mayor and Council policy goals, departmental priority needs, and anticipated funding sources.

**C. STREAMLINING PRACTICES AND NEW TECHNOLOGY**

- 1) **CIP Performance Audit Recommendations.** The CIP Performance Audit conducted by the City Auditor (issued in Sept 2011) made 24 recommendations 23 of which have been agreed to and are at various stages of the completion. More specifically, 15 recommendations have been completed or are near completion while the implementation of 8 recommendations is ongoing and 1 has been disagreed with.
- 2) **CIP Streamlining.** The Public Works staff presented the Council with a number of Streamlining and Contracting Improvements most of which were unanimously approved except where noted here. These improvements included:
  - 1) Increase the threshold for various contracts and agreements and construction change orders;
  - 2) Modify the Municipal Code to allow for Multiple Award Construction Contracts (MACC)\*;

- 3) Modify the Land Development Code as it relates to Site Development Permits for CIP projects (not approved, yet);
- 4) Reconcile Council Policies 600-24 and 600-33 as they relate to park projects; and
- 5) Authorize automatic transfers of project savings at project completion to other Capital Improvements projects.
- 6) Clarify and Streamline Bid Protest Process by modifying the Municipal Code (Chapter 2, Article 2, Division 30)
- 7) Adopt the new Council Policy for CIP Transparency Enhancements (CP 000-31).
- 8) Authorize Mayoral approval to transfer project savings at project completion to other projects.
- 9) Support Regional Procurement Cooperation Program for interagency agreements.
- 10) Discontinue seeking the Council approval for property acquisition when a project budget is approved by Council with a portion of the funding reserved for property acquisition.
- 11) Implement IBA's (Independent Budget Analyst's) recommendations:
  1. Dedicate more time during the annual budget hearing process for CIP review.
  2. Allow direct docketing to full City Council for CIP Projects (i.e., no Committee hearing required).

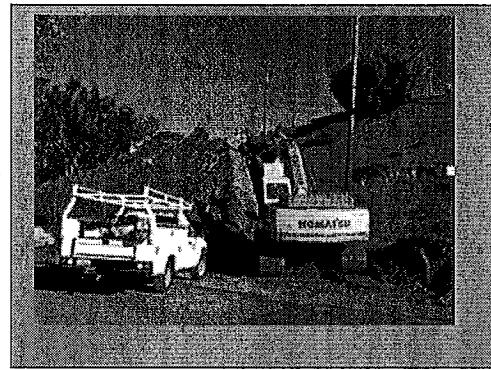
Note: The first group of MACC Design-Builders for utility pipelines has been selected and the base contracts will be submitted to the City Council for approval on October 15<sup>th</sup>, 2012.

The streamlining and contracting measures will significantly change how CIP projects are approved resulting in a minimum savings of three months from the time of bid of a project to the award of the contract. In addition, these changes will result in increased capacity for the Public Works Department which could be used for additional deferred capital projects and CIP transparency efforts.

- 3) **Online Bidding.** During the FY 2012 CIP Streamlining presentation staff committed to implement a state-of-the-art procurement system for construction contracts. An efficient user friendly online bidding system providing electronic creation, issuance and notification of solicitations and preparation and submittal of bids is being procured and implemented. The funding authorization for the procurement of the system is schedule for submittal to the City Council on October 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2012. The system will replace many of the current manual and paper-based processes related to the bid and award of public works construction contracts. This system will improve efficiency and increase long term cost savings for both the city and for bidders.

**4) Innovative Contracting and Project Delivery Methods.** To expedite the execution of CIP, the City has developed a wide range of innovative project delivery methods. Being clearly ahead of many agencies, the City now uses different delivery methods for the CIP projects. The “low-bid” Design-Bid-Build method continues to be the most commonly used system, approximately 75% of the time. While this system is used for both large and small projects, there are situations when other methods are more advantageous. Additional contracting methods include Design-Build, MACC (Multiple Award Construction Contracts), CMAR (Construction Manager At Risk), JOC (Job order Contracting), Sole Source, and As-Needed Emergency On-Call List.

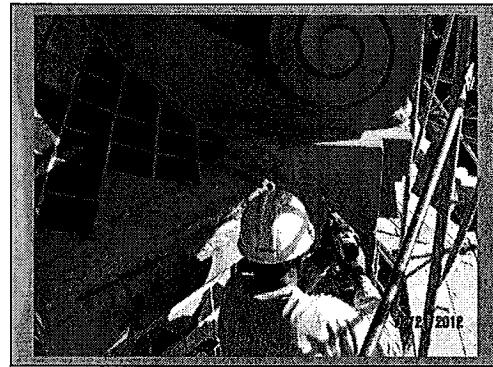
The City also successfully completed its Water Group Job 920 which was a pilot project to test the possibilities of delivering routine projects without extensive detailed design plans. The pilot project relied only on the City’s standard designs, specific GIS maps, and spreadsheets. When compared to a similar recently completed project (i.e., Water Group Job 908), it was completed 6 months faster. The City now plans to expand the use of this process primarily for accelerating similar projects.



#### D. **CIP TRANSPARENCY**

**1) Budget Process and Public Input.** During the FY 2013 budget process, staff was made aware of public concerns about the amount and effectiveness of community input during the CIP budget development. Consequently staff recommended several initial solutions:

1. Step up public outreach efforts in educating the public about the process and how they can be more involved.
2. Seek public feedback for the desired improvements. Develop more centralized online intake points.
3. Post information on and utilize the recently created CIP website. (<http://www.sandiego.gov/cip/index.shtml>)
4. Work with City departments to enhance input and over time develop a centralized online application for receiving and forwarding public requests to the appropriate departments.

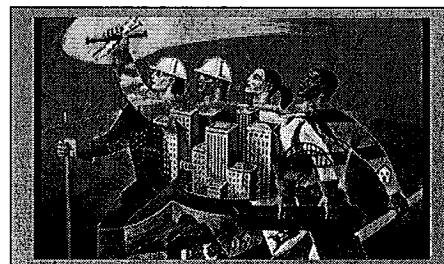


5. Develop simple criteria for screening requests received to sort out project - requests from Recommendation 3.
  6. Increase the role of Community Planners Committees (CPC) to use as a forum for collecting and consolidating community feedback and reporting those requests to the Council and the Mayor prior to April budget deadlines.
- 2) **City's New CIP Website.** In response to the Council Policy 000-31 the City developed a comprehensive one-stop internet site. The site is a major step for enhancing CIP transparency and improving access to the publicly available information related to the CIP. Further upgrades are in the works.

#### E. CIP SUCCESS STORIES

- 1) **Reduced Bid to Award Period.** Shortly after the organizational changes to consolidate Contracting Services with the PWD, the time between the Bid Opening Date and the Contract Award was reduced from six months to less than three months and continues to improve.
- 2) **Improved Statewide Benchmarking Averages.** The City through PWD has been an active participant in the Statewide Benchmarking Group that consists of 7 major cities in California. The group has been cooperating, setting benchmarks, identifying the best management practices, and exchanging performance measures and ideas among the members. The recent data indicates significant improvements in the PWD's delivery costs of the CIP as a percentage of construction hard costs which point to the City's BPR and process improvements initiated in FY 2006. A comparison between the 2009 and 2011 studies show that the City's average soft costs (i.e., administrative costs to manage and deliver the project) have been reduced by 5% points. During this same time, PWD's reimbursement rate for work performed on projects has increased by nearly 3% points. The increased efficiency from streamlining and improved charging practices translates into more revenue and increased project executions.
- 3) **Awards for Excellence in Engineering.**

During FY 2012, the City's public works professionals won 20 prestigious local and national awards for various capital improvement projects. Among the most awarded projects was the Alvarado Water Treatment Plant Upgrade and Expansion which received six awards, including the National Recognition Award from the American Council of Engineering Companies.



The last phase of the upgrade, the installation of ozone facilities, concludes the plant's extensive expansion that began in 1994. Other award-winning projects include the First Avenue over Maple Canyon Bridge Retrofit and Painting Project, the Ocean Air Community Park, Rancho Peñasquitos Pump Station, and the

Garnet Avenue Emergency Storm Drain Replacement Project. The awarding organizations include the American Public Works Association, Construction Management Association of America, the American Society of Civil Engineers and the California Park and Recreation Society. The Harbor Drive Pedestrian Bridge project also won 6 awards including the ACEC National Grand Award Winner and ENR's Best of the Best Award for Transportation.

- 4) **High Quality Construction Documents.** Following several years of intense and continuous improvements to the City's contract documents and specifications, the hard work is paying off. The City is now enjoying all-time lows in bid protests and rejections, claims, change orders, and other contracting nuisances pointing to improved quality. For example, the audits conducted last year indicated construction change orders averages to be well under 5%.

## F. **CHALLENGES AHEAD**

- 1) **Growing Pains.**

Over the next several years and as the local economy improves, the CIP size is expected to continue to grow due to a large volume of work. For instance, staff is expecting a significant increase in the transportation projects once the future planned deferred capital bonds are in place. Also, utility projects are expected to continue at the same or greater rate than over the past few years. This growth combined with a small City work force will continue to present challenges looking for creative approaches, increased consulting work, and possible targeted staff increases while the streamlining efforts continue.

- 2) **Centralizing Project Budget and Schedule Data.**

One of the CIPRAC's new responsibilities is to centralize CIP information. The CIP website is the first step. However, to have real-time and readily accessible information, as the next step, CIPRAC is exploring means and methods to centralize CIP budget and schedule related data among various databases currently in use by the various asset owning departments. Centralizing information will greatly improve future Reports.

- 3) **CIP prioritization Policy 800-14.**

Staff has developed a draft of a revised objective and comprehensive prioritization formula that is not only unique in the City but also more comprehensive than those currently used by other agencies. It is currently in the community outreach stage of this effort. The challenge with amending the Council Policy is the time necessary to allow for community involvement and input. The policy should be approved and implemented for better balancing of needs and available resources without delay.

- 4) **Multi-Year CIP Budget/Program.**

Buildings, infrastructure, technology, and major equipment are the physical foundation for providing services to the City's constituents. The procurement,

construction, and maintenance of capital assets are a critical activity of the City and therefore require careful planning through the review of the City's capital needs and funding programs each year through a compressive integrated capital asset management system. However, a prudent multi-year capital plan identifies and prioritizes expected needs based on a community's strategic plan, establishes project scope and cost, detailed estimated amounts of funding from various sources, and projects future operating and maintenance costs that will expand well beyond one year.

The CIP Audit of 2011 elaborated how important it was for the City to implement a multi-year plan in addition to annual CIP budget. The challenge now remains to implement and adopt comprehensive multi-year capital plans to ensure effective management of capital assets. Capital plan must comprehensively evaluate anticipated capital spending needs and identify potential funding sources.

## **5) Additional Challenges in Implementing CIP.**

- a) Not being able to fully fund projects, which means that the City would not be able to take advantage of certain project delivery methods such as Design-Build that could establish current day unit price levels by requiring the full project cost be available up front.
- b) A continuously growing list of needs with dynamic priorities (e.g., what is a top priority today, may be overcome by another project of higher priority tomorrow).
- c) The deteriorating nature of deferred capital e.g., a particular issue worsens with time, costing more to fully address the longer it's deferred.
- d) The need for investment in condition assessment and planning efforts to better budget for and schedule future CIP projects.
- e) The increase in environmental and code requirements on implementing projects (e.g., storm water quality requirements) that drives up the cost and time to implement CIP projects.
- f) The difficulty in projecting the future's economic outlook which impacts project cost estimate, industry competitiveness, etc.

## **G. ADDITIONAL STREAMLINING RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 1)** Increase the JOC Task Order limit for roadway and pipeline construction from \$1M to \$5M to increase the rate at which these projects within the City's Right of Way can be awarded.
- 2)** Modify the Land Development Code as it relates to Site Development Permits for CIP projects to shorten the design phase. See IBA Report Number: 12-04.

## SECTION III

### CIP PROJECT PERFORMANCE

#### A. PERFORMANCE MEASURES

Following the Audit Committee's recommendations (i.e., Recommendation #13), staff made several significant changes to implement a system of measures to track and monitor the CIP progress starting with the FY 2013. The citywide CIP now has a set of consistent and comprehensive measures which are Metrics and Key performance Indicators (KPIs) along with established targets. The Report focuses on two areas: Baseline Budget and Schedule Changes and recently Completed Projects. See Table III(A)1 for a partial list of those measures applied to the FY 2012 for illustration purposes.

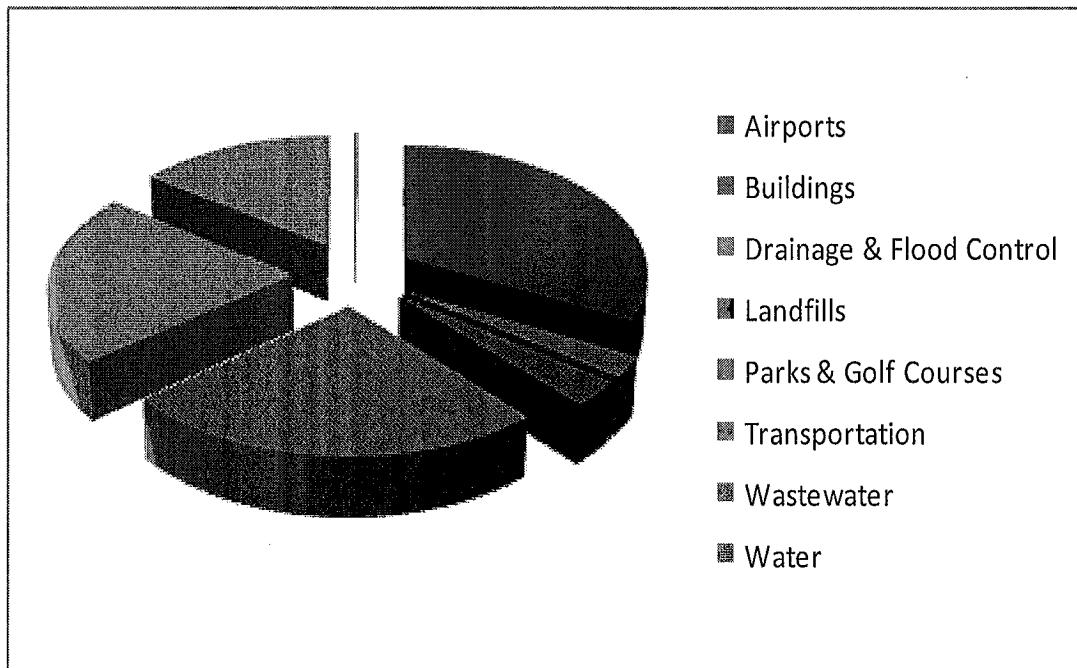

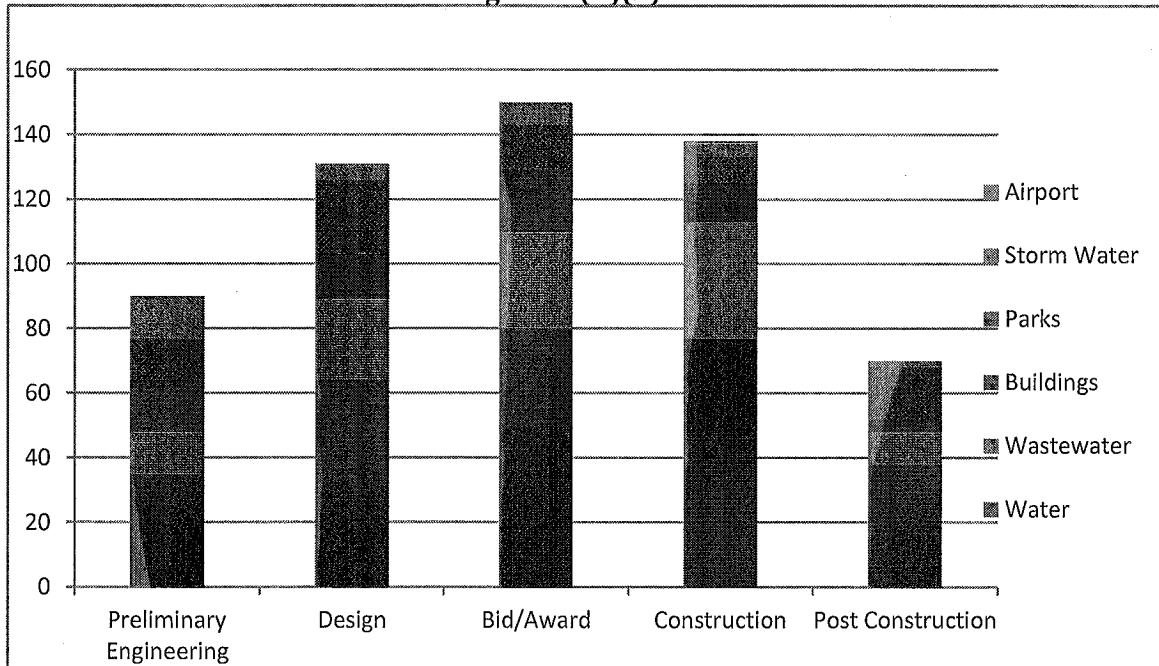

- 5) *Upcoming Construction Contracts (FY 2013)* – Please see the updated CIP FY2013 Construction Projects Contract Award List that accompanies this submittal as a stand-alone document informing the City Council of the changes since May 2012. The information was last submitted as part of the Mayor's May Revision to the budget. In summary, as of this date, PWD has Awarded 21 projects for a Construction Value of \$44.6M. A total of 8 projects have been deleted from the list with a Construction Value of \$13.7M and 21 projects were added for a Construction Value of \$23.6M.

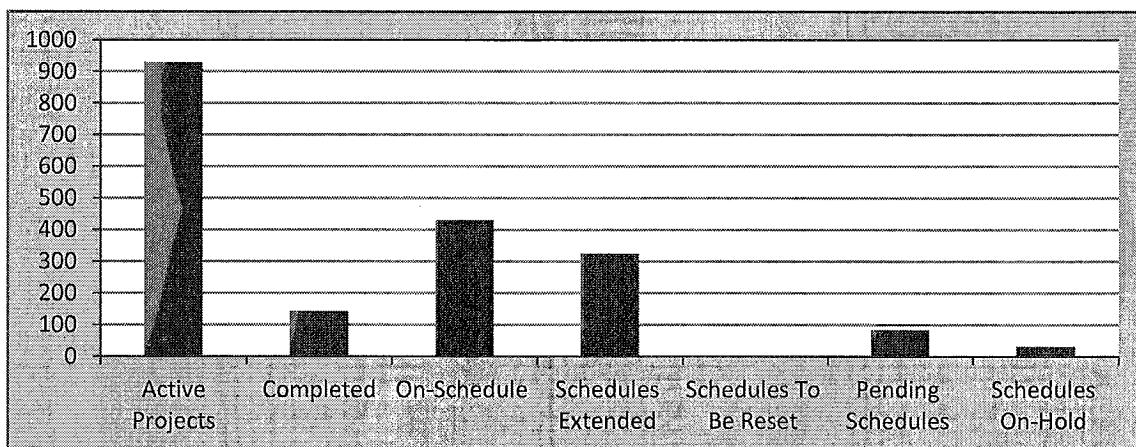
#### **C. BASELINE BUDGET AND SCHEDULE CHANGES**

As noted in the introduction to this Report, baseline schedules and budgets are established for CIP projects as a commitment for delivery and a reference point for measuring on-time and on-budget project delivery performance. In the normal course of delivering public projects, however, projects are often re-scoped to take advantage of additional funding or to address the changing needs of a community. In order to realign the project delivery commitments with a revised scope, a baseline budget or schedule adjustment (reset) may be proposed. Table III(C)1 below summarizes the schedule status and changes (if any) for FY 2012 projects in the PWD's database.

Although the established standard for “on-schedule” status is high (i.e., 22 Working Days or 1 month), staff acknowledges that better monitoring and accountability are needed for keeping more projects on track in addition to re-visiting the current target.

#### D. Professional Service Agreements

In FY 2012 the City awarded 55 CIP related agreements to other agencies and private firms for providing professional services such as design. The total awarded amount for the year was \$30,558,138.

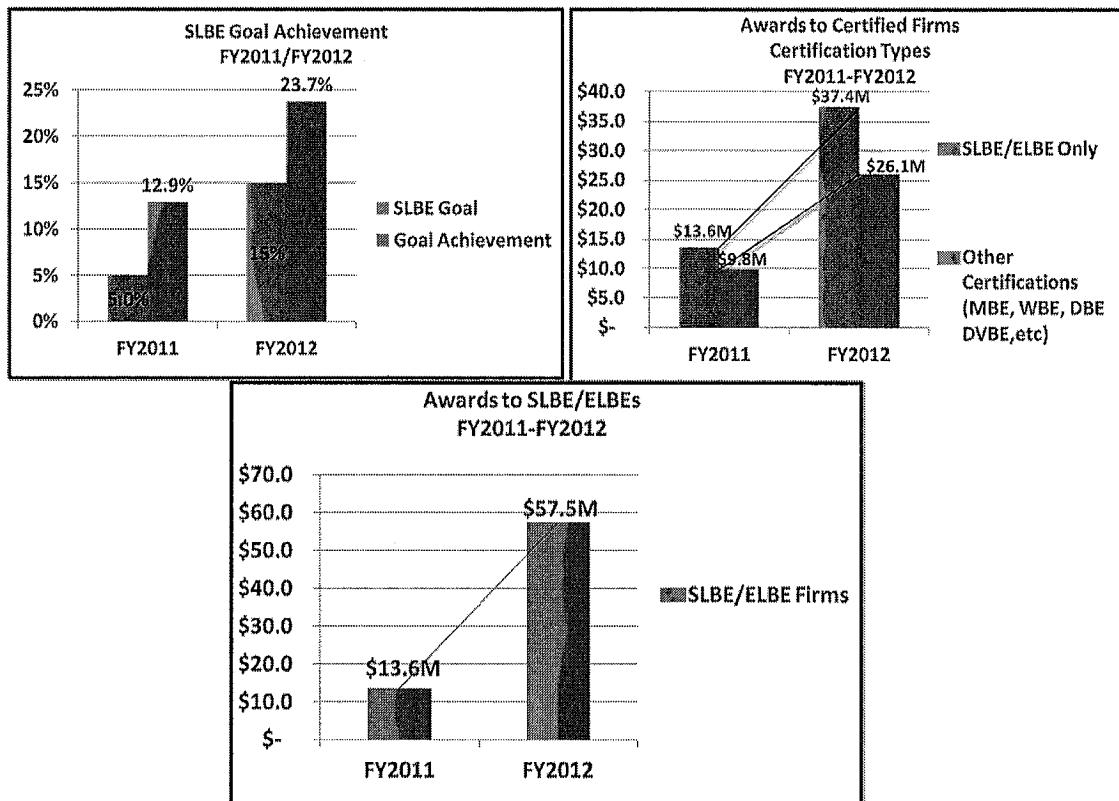
#### E. Equal Opportunity Contracting Program

Small businesses are the backbone of San Diego's economy. After two full years of implementation and over 545 available certified firms in the City's database, the Small Local Business Enterprise (SLBE) Program has proven to be an extremely effective tool to increase prime and subcontracting opportunities for all segments of the small local business community.



- 1) Annual Citywide CIP Subcontracting Goals.** FY 2012 was another outstanding year. Once again the City exceeded its Small Local Business Enterprise annual goal for CIP Construction Projects. City certified SLBEs received \$57.5 million (23.7%) of construction contract dollars awarded. Total awards to all City-recognized certified firms, was \$63.5 million (26.2%).

There was also an increase in contract awards to certified consulting firms totaling at 27%. See EOCP's FY 2012 Annual Report for details.

- 2) Public Works CIP Streamlining Positive Impacts on SLBEs.** The Public Works Department CIP Streamlining effort significantly increased the number of restricted competition awards to certified firms. In addition, to ensure small

contract opportunities continue to be made available, a goal of 15% of eligible CIP Construction and Architect & Engineering projects be sized to facilitate prime contracting opportunities for SLBE/ELBE firms was established. The inclusion of mandatory SLBE/ELBE/DVBE participation levels on Multiple Award Construction Contract (MACC) tasks in both phases (design/construction) and the inclusion of a mandatory networking event for shortlisted prime contractors, provides additional subcontracting opportunities and targeted networking for these certified firms.

- 3) **Vendor Registration Status.** A 2007 Mayoral Task Force requested the City implement a comprehensive vendor registration system. As a result, a system was implemented in 2008 but was unsuccessful since it was not tied to the procurement system. Consequently the ITBLG (Information Technology Business Leadership Group) recently approved the staff recommendation to implement a solution to provide Vendor Registration and eSourcing. The proposed solution is a comprehensive citywide system through which vendors register and maintain their profile on line. The system also provides electronic creation and issuance of solicitations by City staff, automatic vendor notification of solicitations and electronic preparation, submittal and staff tabulation of vendor responses. It also facilitates analysis and reporting on all aspects of vendor registration and procurement including success in engaging vendors and identifying strategic sourcing opportunities.
- 4) **Online Tutorial.** Following a model developed by the San Diego Airport Authority, the City initiated a project to develop free online tutorial for bidders of all sizes to learn more about contracting opportunities and the bidding process. The City has hundreds of projects at any given time covering a wide variety of assets serving the residents of San Diego. On this website bidders will be able to view available contracts, apply for pre-qualification program, learn about the bidding process, how to become certified under the City's SLBE program, review Bid results and much more.

## **SECTION IV**

### **CONCLUSION**

In compliance with Section H(1), Council Policy 000-31, the State of CIP Status Report provides the Council up to date information on the status of currently active CIP projects to help facilitate decision making in the upcoming budget cycle.

The PWD has already delivered 138 projects in the FY 2012 CIP and is expected to deliver an additional 166 CIP projects by the end of the FY 2013, representing an influx of over \$428 million into the local construction industry and our City's investment in providing residents with facilities that improve the quality of life in San Diego.

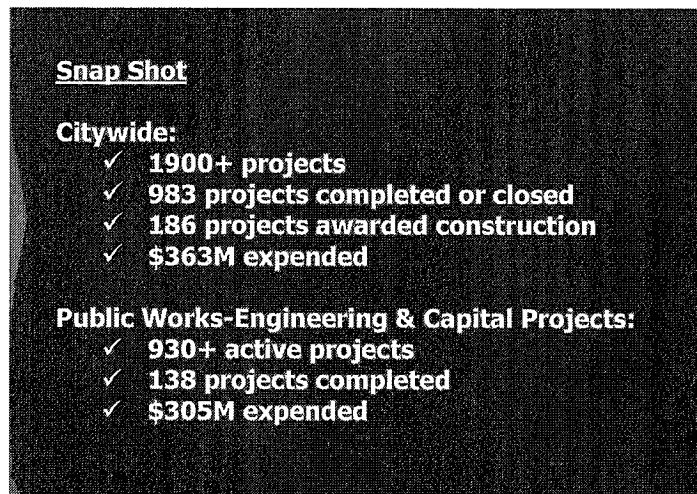

- 2)** Modify the Land Development Code as it relates to Site Development Permits for CIP projects to shorten the design phase. See IBA Report Number: 12-04.

Being the CIPRAC's first report of this kind, staff acknowledges possible shortcomings due to the significant amount of changes taking place since the CIP Streamlining measures were approved and the challenges currently facing staff such as the lack of a more centralized information system. Therefore, we are looking forward to the City Council's feedback and suggestions for improving the Report and making it an award winning and invaluable tool in a completely transparent CIP.

The next Report is scheduled for submittal shortly prior to the start of the FY 2014 budget process.
