

RESOLUTION NO. 186386

WHEREAS, a number of flood control projects are presently under consideration by the City, State and Federal government; and

WHEREAS, Federal assistance is available to finance the construction of such projects; and

WHEREAS, State assistance is available to reimburse the City for costs incurred in the acquisition of rights of way for such projects; and

WHEREAS, Section 8400, et seq. of the California Water Code (known as the Cobey-Alquist Flood Plain Management Act) was adopted during the 1965 Legislative Session and has become effective; and

WHEREAS, the Cobey-Alquist Act has as a condition of State participation in a flood control project, a requirement that a local agency establish flood plain management regulations; and

WHEREAS, the State of California, Department of Water Resources, has notified the City of the need for the adoption of such regulations and has established February 24, 1966, as the deadline for the submission of regulations by the City; and

WHEREAS, it appears that the most appropriate method to effectuate the intent of the Cobey-Alquist Act is to create new zoning classifications which can be used throughout the City on various flood control projects; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

That the City of San Diego Planning Commission hold public hearings on the creation of flood control zoning classifications and submit its findings and a proposed ordinance to the Council at the earliest opportunity.
