A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR DESIGNEE TO APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT GRANT FUNDS FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF THE CALIFORNIA HIGHWAY PATROL, AND TO ENTER INTO ALL AGREEMENTS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE CALIFORNIA HIGHWAY PATROL CANNABIS TAX FUND LAW ENFORCEMENT GRANT FOR FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2021 TO 2022; AND AUTHORIZING THE CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER OR DESIGNEE TO ACCEPT, APPROPRIATE, AND EXPEND GRANT FUNDS AWARDED UNDER THE CALIFORNIA HIGHWAY PATROL CANNABIS TAX FUND LAW ENFORCEMENT GRANT FOR FY 2021 TO 2022.

WHEREAS, beginning January 1, 2018, the State of California imposed a 15% excise tax on the purchasers of cannabis and cannabis products as well as a cultivation tax on all harvested cannabis; and

WHEREAS, section 34019(f)(3)(B) of the California Revenue and Taxation Code allocates 20% of the excise tax funds to the State and Local Government Law Enforcement Account (Law Enforcement Account) which is dispersed by the California Highway Patrol (CHP); and

WHEREAS, the CHP uses the funds in the Law Enforcement Account to provide grants to local governments for education, prevention, and enforcement of laws related to driving under the influence of alcohol and other drugs (DUID), including cannabis; and

WHEREAS, local governments use these monies to fund programs that help enforce traffic laws and educate the public in traffic safety with the goal of reducing fatalities, injuries, and economic losses from collisions; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego Police Department will utilize grant funds to conduct DUID patrols, conduct community outreach, and provide specialized officer training with the goal of reducing DUID crashes by 5% during the grant period; and

WHEREAS, there is no state match or cost share required for grants under the Cannabis Tax Fund Law Enforcement Grant for Fiscal Year (FY) 2021 to 2022 (Law Enforcement Grant); however, these grants are reimbursable in nature, requiring the City to expend funds prior to requesting reimbursement; and

WHEREAS, expenditures will be initially sourced from fund 600001 (Grant Fund - State), and then reimbursed from the Law Enforcement Grant; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of San Diego, that the Mayor, or his designee, is authorized to apply for and accept \$882,407.75 and any additional grant funding authorized by the CHP, including any amendments, extensions, or renewals for a period of up to five years, provided funding is secured and made available by the CHP for the purpose of implementing the Law Enforcement Grant Program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief Financial Officer, or his designee, is authorized to increase the FY 2022 Budget, and to accept, appropriate, and expend \$882,407.75 and any additional grant funding awarded under the Law Enforcement Grant Program, including any amendments, extensions, or renewals of the grant for a period of up to five years, provided funding is secured and made available by the CHP, for the purpose of implementing the Law Enforcement Grant Program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor, or his designee, is authorized to enter into all agreements and certifications necessary for the purpose of implementing the Law Enforcement Grant Program.
