

REGULAR MEETING OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA - THURSDAY, AUGUST 9, 1973

Deputy Mayor Martinet called the Regular Meeting to order at  
9:33 a.m.

(Item 1)

Deputy Mayor Martinet welcomed seven visitors from Yokohama,  
Japan, accompanied by Mr. Geerd Von Hagerhorst, Board Member of  
San Diego Yokohama Sister City Society, General Chairman of Youth  
Exchange Program.

Councilman Morrow addressed the group.

(Item 2)

Deputy Mayor Martinet welcomed members of Cub Scout Den #8,  
Pack 292, of Kearny Mesa, accompanied by Mrs. Marlene Morrow.

Councilman Morrow addressed the group.

(Item 3)

The Purchasing Agent reported on all bids opened Wednesday,  
August 8, 1973, for paving and otherwise improving Bonita Drive,  
between Cervantes Avenue and Olvera Avenue; five bids received.

Finding was made on motion of Councilman Landt that bids had  
been opened and declared as reported. By the same motion, report  
was referred to the City Manager and City Attorney for recommendation.

The Council at this time considered requests for continuances:  
Items 8 and 101, and Supplemental Docket Item 1.

(Item 8)

ORDINANCES INTRODUCED AT A PREVIOUS MEETING, READY FOR DISPENSING  
WITH THE READING AND ADOPTION:

Amending Chapter VI, Article 2, Division 4, of the San Diego Municipal  
Code by adding Section 62.0404.5 relative to Clearing and Grubbing  
Incidental to Land Development Work.

On motion of Councilman Landt, said Ordinance was continued to  
Thursday, September 6, 1973, at City Manager's request.

(Item 101)

RESOLUTIONS - MISCELLANEOUS: (Continued from the Meetings of July 12 and 19, 1973.)

Authorizing the City Manager to modify the San Diego Regional Summer Youth Program upon receipt of the Neighborhood Youth Corps (NYC) - Department of Labor funds.

On motion of Councilman Landt, said Resolution was continued for one week, to Thursday, August 16, 1973, at City Manager's request.

(Item 1 - Supplemental Docket)

COMMUNICATIONS: James W. Barnett, representing the Mission Beach Town Council, requesting permission to address the Council to present for their consideration additional information relevant to Belmont Park lease resolution.

On motion of Councilman Morrow, said communication was continued for one week, to Thursday, August 16, 1973, for full Council.

The Council considered the Consent Agenda, which consisted of Items 6, 7, 10, 100, 103, and 104.

The following Ordinances were introduced at the Meeting of July 26, 1973.

Reading in full was dispensed with by a vote of not less than a majority of the members elected to the Council, and there was available for the consideration of each member of the Council and the public prior to the day of their passage written or printed copies of said Ordinances.

The following Ordinances were adopted on motion of Councilman Johnson, by the following vote: Yeas-Councilmen Johnson, Landt, Morrow, Bates, and Deputy Mayor Martinet. Nays-None. Absent-Councilmen O'Connor, Williams, Hitch, and Mayor Wilson:

(Item 6 - CASE NO. 60-70-4 E.O.T.)

ORDINANCE 11102 (New Series), incorporating a portion of Section 11, Township 15 South, Range 3 West, into M-LB Zone, as defined by Section 101.0435.2 of the San Diego Municipal Code, and repealing Ordinance No. 10936 (New Series), adopted October 5, 1972, of the Ordinances of The City of San Diego insofar as the same conflicts herewith.

(Item 7 - CASE NO. 43-73-5)

ORDINANCE 11103 (New Series), incorporating a portion of Lot 43, The Highlands, into M-LB Zone, as defined by Section 101.0435.2 of the San Diego Municipal Code, and repealing Ordinance No. 10936 (New Series), adopted October 5, 1972, of the Ordinances of The City of San Diego insofar as the same conflicts herewith.

(Item 10)

The following Resolutions, relative to awarding contracts, were adopted on motion of Councilman Landt:

RESOLUTION 208573, Woodward Sand & Materials Co. for the purchase of approximately twelve hundred tons of washed plaster sand, for an actual estimated cost of \$8,458.80, including tax and terms; and

RESOLUTION 208574, Dale E. Carroll for the purchase of approximately seven hundred fifty cu. yd. of greens mixture, for an actual estimated cost of \$5,467.61, including tax and terms.

(Item 100)

The following Resolutions, relative to the final subdivision map of Villa Trinidad Unit 4, were adopted on motion of Councilman Landt:

RESOLUTION 208575, authorizing an agreement with The Christiana Companies, Inc. for completion of improvements in Villa Trinidad Unit 4, a 102-lot subdivision located between Clairemont Mesa Boulevard and Tierrasanta Boulevard, easterly of Santo Drive; and

RESOLUTION 208576, approving the final map of Villa Trinidad Unit 4.

(Item 103)

RESOLUTION 208577, authorizing a Contract Agreement with the San Diego Community College District to provide said District with relocation services, was adopted on motion of Councilman Landt.

(Item 104)

RESOLUTION 208578, authorizing the City Manager to make application to the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California for public street crossings located in G. W. Industrial Park Subdivisions, was adopted on motion of Councilman Landt.

(Item 4)

The hour of 9:30 a.m. having arrived, the Deputy Mayor announced this was the time and place set for the hearing on the application of Tota-A-Crew Company, by Joseph M. Lemm and Robert M. Caricato, for Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate two automobiles for hire, to provide transportation for flight-crew members between the International Airport and downtown hotels, within the limits of the City of San Diego. It was reported that no written protests had been received.

Assistant City Manager Graham answered questions directed by the Council.

Joseph Lemm appeared to speak in favor of the application.

Ed Allensworth and Bill Hilton appeared to speak in opposition to the application.

The hearing was closed and the following Resolution adopted on motion of Councilman Landt:

RESOLUTION 208579, denying a Certificate of Public Convenience and

Necessity to Joseph M. Lemm and Robert Caricato to operate the vehicles specified in the application.

In addition, Councilman Bates directed the City Manager to provide a comprehensive study of cabs and autos for hire and the cost of said study.

(Item 5)

The hour of 9:30 a.m. having arrived, the Deputy Mayor announced this was the time and place set for the hearing on the report of Public Works Director showing cost of Weed and Litter Abatement Program upon certain streets, sidewalks and private property in areas of the City - under Resolution 207827. It was reported that no written protests had been received.

Assistant City Manager Graham and Ray Skinner, Public Works Department, answered questions directed by the Council.

No one appeared to be heard.

The hearing was closed and the following Resolution adopted on motion of Councilman Bates:

RESOLUTION 208580, confirming the report of the contractor showing the cost of weed abatement against each parcel of land in said report, making such cost a special assessment against that parcel, and directing the City Clerk to forward a certified copy of this Resolution, together with a copy of said report, to the office of the San Diego County Auditor on or before August 10, 1973.

(Item 9)

A proposed Ordinance, introduced July 26, 1973, amending Chapter II, Article 7, of the San Diego Municipal Code by adding Division 30, Sections 27.3001 through 27.3005 Establishing a Campaign Fairness Ordinance, was presented.

Chief Deputy City Attorney Conrad answered questions directed by the Council.

A motion made by Councilman Morrow to Introduce the Ordinance dated August 8, 1973 which amended said Ordinance to require identification of the material and the person who put it out, died for lack of a second.

On motion of Councilman Morrow, said proposed Ordinance was continued for one week, to Thursday, August 16, 1973, for full Council.

(Item 102)

A proposed Resolution, continued from the Meeting of August 2, 1973, for further evaluation, adopting the 1973 Map of Population-Based Park Service Districts of the City, was presented.

RESOLUTION 208581, adopting the 1973 Map of Population-Based Park Service Districts of the City, was adopted on motion of Councilman Bates.

(Item 105)

A proposed Resolution, authorizing the City Manager to negotiate

an agreement with the Mexican Civic Association-Comite Pro Fiesta of San Ysidro to produce and coordinate the celebration of Mexican Independence, September 14-16, 1973; reimbursement of said corporation to be made from Transient Occupancy Tax Fund for expenses incurred in an amount not to exceed \$3,200, was presented.

Councilman Johnson left the Chamber.

Ramon Para appeared to speak in favor of the proposed Resolution.

RESOLUTION 208582, authorizing the City Manager to negotiate an agreement with the Mexican Civic Association-Comite Pro Fiesta of San Ysidro to produce and coordinate the celebration of Mexican Independence, September 14-16, 1973; reimbursement of said corporation to be made from Transient Occupancy Tax Fund for expenses incurred in an amount not to exceed \$3,200, was adopted on motion of Councilman Bates.

In addition, Councilman Morrow directed the City Manager to provide a draft regarding guidelines to be established on funds given to festivities from Transient Occupancy Tax Fund 224, and to report back to Council within 60 days.

On the docket, there appeared a General Notice of the Mayor's intention to appoint Manuel R. Camacho to the Model Cities Citizen Advisory Board for a term ending December 31, 1973, to replace Jim Estrada, who has resigned.

There being no further business to come before the Council at this time, by Unanimous Consent granted to Deputy Mayor Martinet, the Regular Meeting was adjourned in memory of Mr. Arthur Hamilton Marston, former civic leader, at 10:49 a.m.
