The Deputy Mayor announced at the meeting of April 17, 1975, the Council commenced hearings on the proposed formation of Park District No. 8 (Del Mar Heights) for the purpose of acquiring and improving park lands adjacent to the Torrey Pines State Reserve. The April 17 hearing was continued to July 17 and further continued to today, September 25, for the purpose of ascertaining the probable outcome of A.B. No. 1147. That bill provides for a state appropriation of \$250,000 for the state acquisition of the same lands proposed to be financed and acquired by the city in the pending park district proceedings. The bill has been passed by both houses of the Legislature and signed by the Governor.

The \$250,000 state appropriation is adequate to cover the estimated acquisition costs and dispenses with the necessity for the city to raise additional acquisition funds. Unless the Council wishes to further discuss the matter or hear from interested persons, it appears that the pending park district proceedings can be safely abandoned.
