There were no requests for continuances.

Councilman Haro entered the Chambers.

The hour of 8:30 a.m. having arrived, the Deputy Mayor announced this  
was the time and place set for the hearing on the matter of: Vacating

of Intention No. 2150320.

J. R. Crosby, Engineering and Development, presented his report.  
No one appeared to be heard.

Subarea B consists of 151 acres of R-4 zoned property generally bounded on west by Averil Road, on the north by the easterly prolongation of Vista Lane, on the east by Beyer Boulevard, and on the south by San Ysidro Boulevard.

Victor Sparza appeared to address the Council in opposition to R-2A and R-3 Zoning and presented a petition to retain the R-4 Zoning.

Councilman Williams entered the Chambers.

Nays-Councilmen Hubbard and Ellis. Absent-Mayor Wilson.

The motion of Councilman Haro to adopt the recommendation to rezone from R-4 to R-2A Zone on the remaining area of Subarea B, failed due to the lack of five affirmative votes by the following vote: Yeas-Councilmen O'Connor, Williams, Morrow and Haro. Nay-Councilmen Johnson, Hubbard, Gade and Ellis. Absent-Mayor Wilson.

Subarea C - CASE NO. 48-75-7 - City-initiated - Drawing C-463)

Consists of 32.3 acres of R-4 zones property generally bounded on the west by the westerly boundary of Section 1, Township 19 South, Range 2 West, on the north by a line approximately 270 feet south and parallel to Bolton Hall Road and Sunrise Drive, on the east by Willow Road, and on the south by Ensenda Street.

The property is portions of Sections 35 and 36, Township 14 South, Range 2 West, and portions of Sections 1 and 2, Township 15 South, Range 2 West, S.B.B.M., in the R-1-40 and A-1-10 Zones.
