SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA - TUESDAY, DECEMBER 14, 1976  
IN THE CHAMBERS OF THE COUNCIL - ADMINISTRATION BUILDING

Mayor Wilson called the Regular Meeting to order at 2:13 p.m.

(Item 1)

Roll call was taken.

(Item 2)

Mayor Wilson introduced Reverend Fred E. Zacharies, Pastor, East San Diego Christian Church, who gave the Invocation.

Councilwoman O'Connor led the Pledge of Allegiance.

(Item 20)

The hour of 2:00 p.m. having arrived, the Mayor announced this was the time and place set for the hearing on the matter of considering the applications of the six finalists for appointment to fill the vacancy which exists in Council District No. 7.

A motion by Councilman Williams to abandon the appointment process and instruct the City Attorney to prepare an Ordinance calling for a Special Election, received no vote at this time.

Councilwoman O'Connor addressed the Council declaring that she would not vote in the appointment process.

City Attorney Witt addressed the Council stating that each Councilman present must vote unless there is a conflict of interest, and answered questions directed by the Council.

The Council discussed the matter.

A vote was then taken on the previous motion of Councilman Williams' to abandon the appointment process and instruct the City Attorney to prepare an Ordinance calling for a Special Election, which failed due to the lack of five affirmative votes by the following vote: Yeas-Councilmen O'Connor, Williams, Morrow, and Haro. Nays-Councilmen Johnson, Hubbard, Gade, and Mayor Wilson. Absent-None. District 7 - Vacant.

A motion by Councilman Morrow stating that the appointee is to serve on an interim basis, and not to run for office in the 1977 elections, received no vote.

A proposed Resolution, approving the availability of the University Avenue and 52nd Street site for the development of low-income senior citizen and handicapped housing under the HUD Section 8 Program; authorizing the City Manager to execute a Lease Agreement with Gentry and Coles for said City-owned property for a period of 55 years, was presented.

By Common Consent, the matter was continued to Wednesday, December 22, 1976, a.m., at the lessees request.
