


We understand that you and the Qualcomm staff are proposing an ordinance that will ban glass bottles from the parking lots at Stadium events. We support your efforts to have this ban.

We believe that the banning of glass bottles will enhance public safety, comfort and welfare at Qualcomm Stadium.



Dear Erik,

On behalf of Ace Parking, I want to voice our support for a glass bottle ban for the Qualcomm Stadium and parking lot. In addition to the security issue in terms of bottles potentially becoming a weapon, we have numerous incidents each season where glass creates injuries or damage to vehicle tires. Furthermore, the clean-up after games is much more difficult in terms of clearing broken glass from the asphalt, corners and behind wheel stops. If glass is prohibited, many of these potential problems will be minimized, if not eliminated.

We feel that there are sufficient alternatives available to customers that they no longer need to rely on bottles. With the use of plastic for most food and beverage containers, limiting bottles in the parking lots will provide a safer environment for everyone. Therefore, Ace Parking supports a ban on glass products at Qualcomm Stadium and its parking areas.
